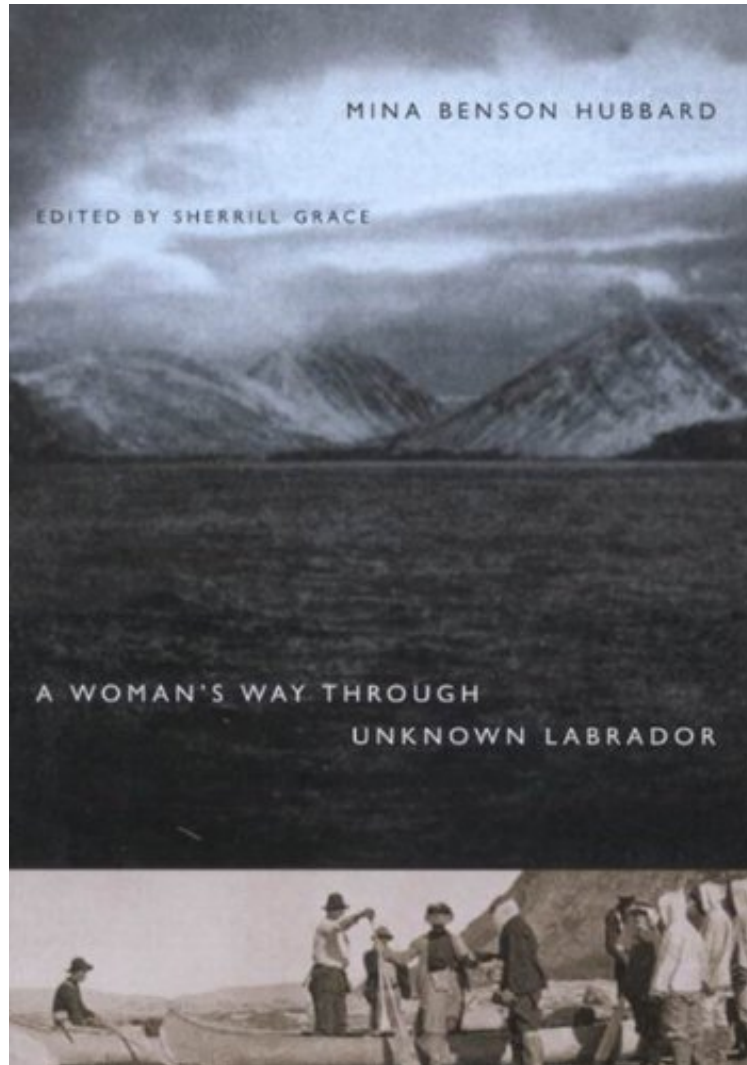

seen in other books (such as *Great Heart: The History of a Labrador Adventure*; *Lure of the Labrador Wild*) of Labrador expeditions, but I was disappointed - there isn't any picture in this book. The publisher just did not include any pictures that Mrs. Mina Benson Hubbard had taken in her expedition. Besides, the print is very small.

In 1905 Mina Benson Hubbard became the first white person to cross Labrador, documenting her experience as she travelled. This edited and annotated version of the original 1908 publication features an introduction that situates Hubbard's writing in the context of her life.
