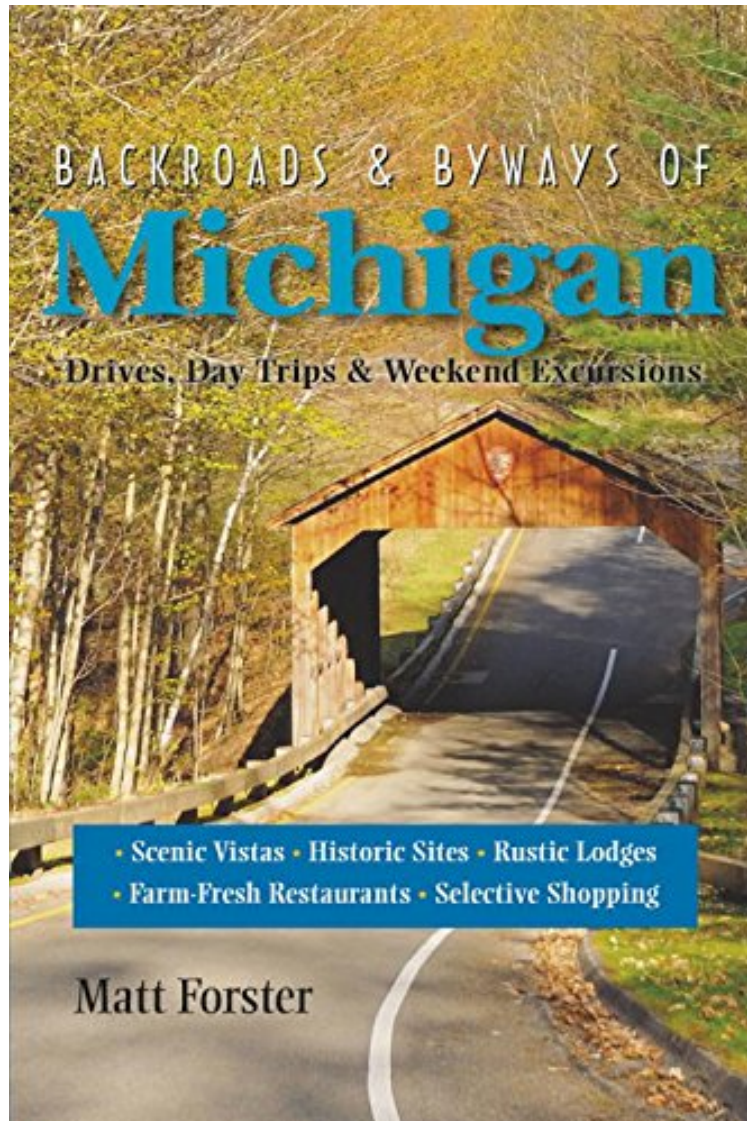

Some of his descriptions made a historic site sound pretty impressive, even with costumed guides. We would get there and there would be two or three buildings that were self-guided. Many of his directions were wrong or missing. He said the Eastern Market in Detroit was open Monday through Saturday. By this time I knew to call before going.
