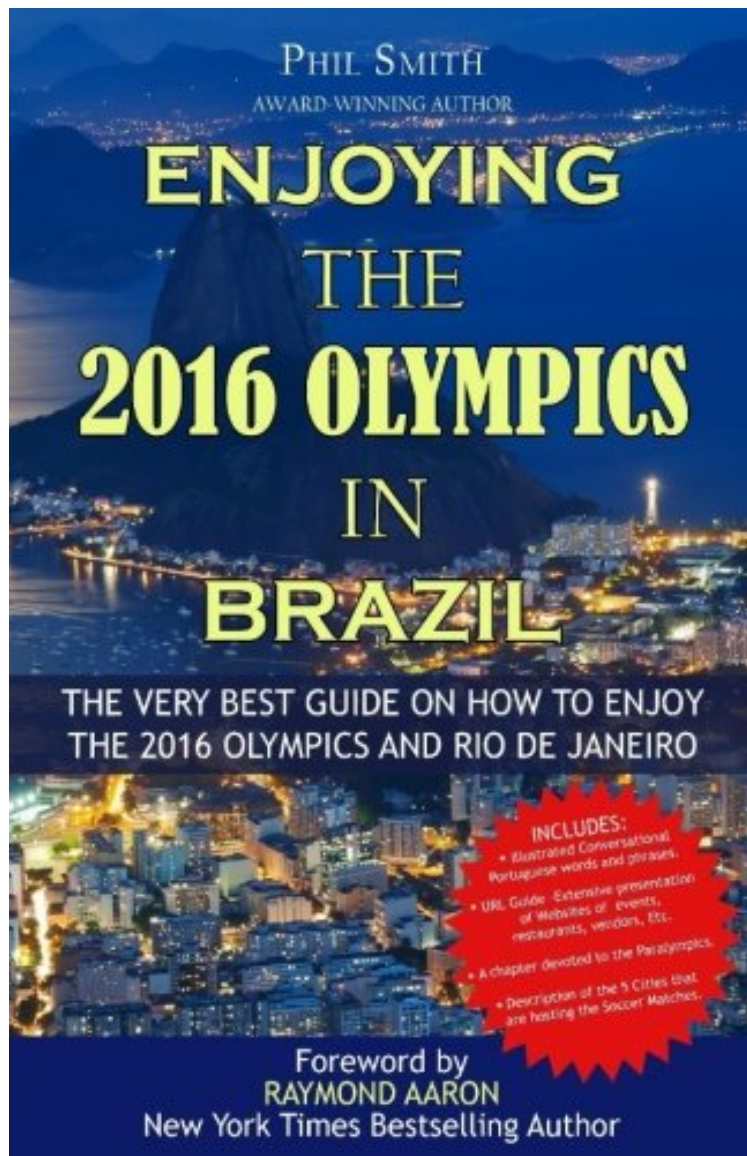


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Enjoying the 2016 Olympics in Brazil: The very best guide on how to enjoy the 2016 Olympics and Rio de Janeiro
