Most important, the author reminds you that the journey is physically taxing and you may not enjoy being jostled by the crowds in certain locations.The author seems quite knowledgeable, but there are one or two odd places. On page 28, for example, he refers to the Temple of the Sun as an "infamous location," but doesn't explain why. Perhaps because it was "used for ... likely [sic] religious sacrifices?"
