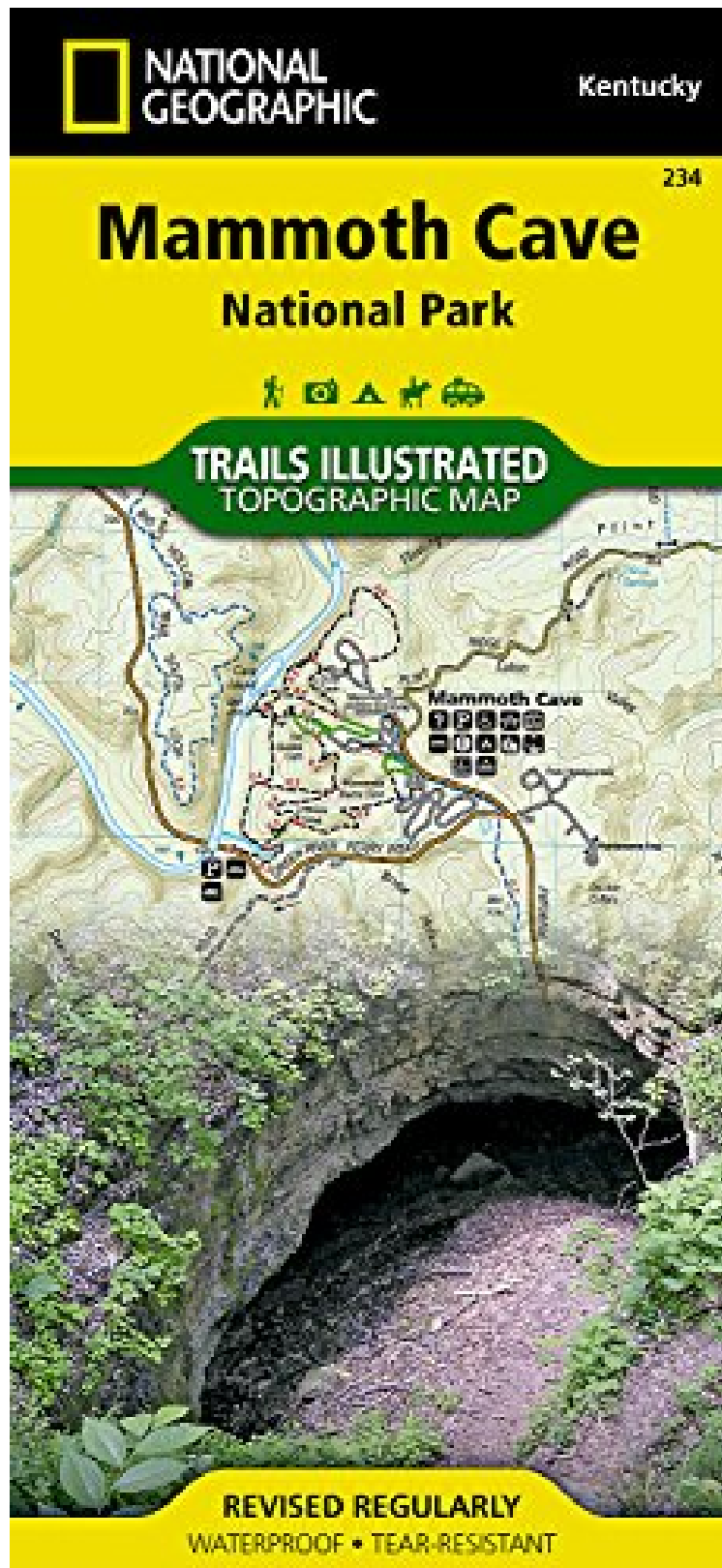

No Longer AccurateBy MMThis is a really nice map - durable, waterproof, a good size, and according to the park ranger, it used to be accurate. However, as of early 2015, most of the trails north of the river have been reconfigured and many of the trails shown on the map are CLOSED. You are better off with the free backcountry trails map provided at the visitor center.
