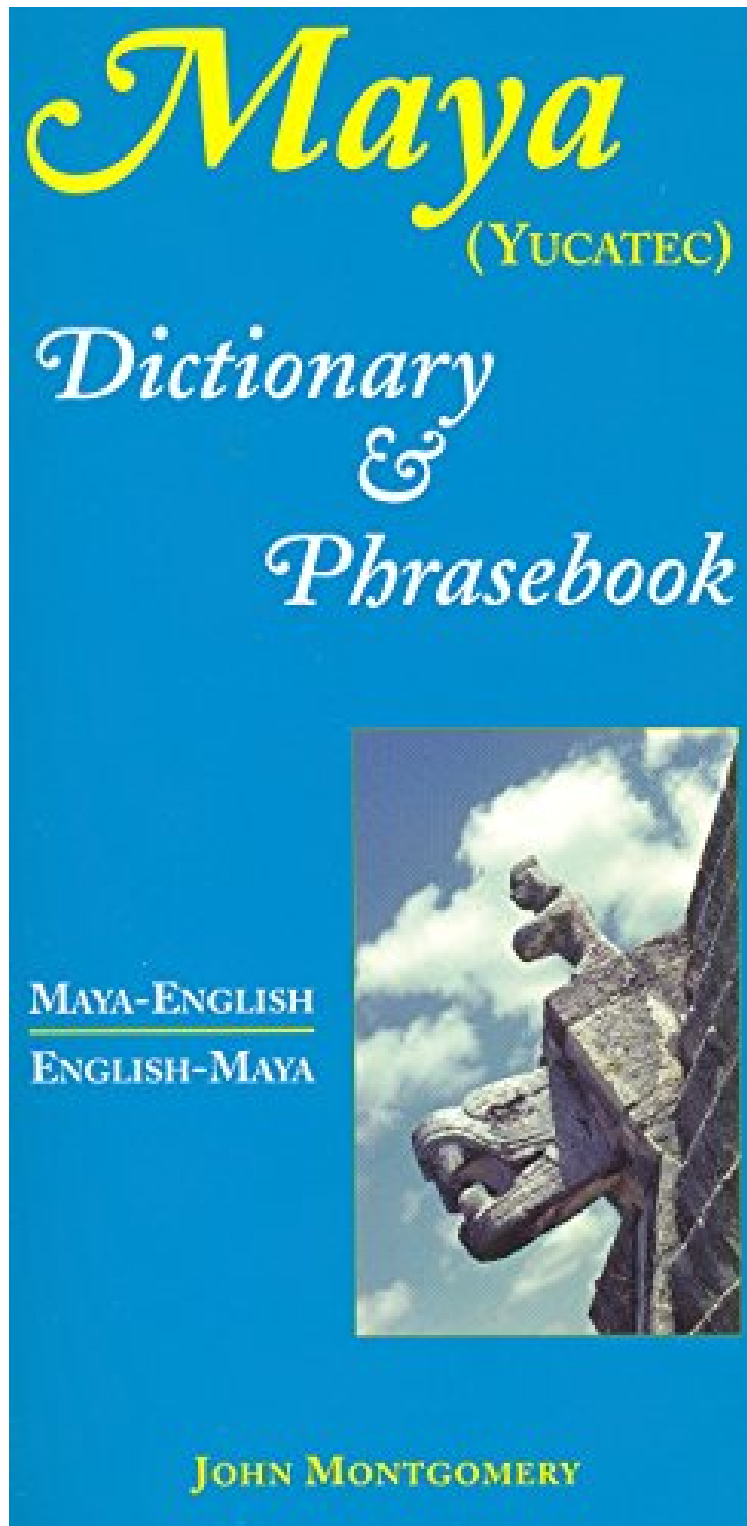

This book has a phrasebook and a small dictionary, which was useful to my task but not adequate for all the words I needed to know, so I had to buy several dictionaries in order to get all the words I wanted. I can recommend this book as a good starting point for Yucatec Mayan, but it is a small resource that you will need to supplement with other books.
