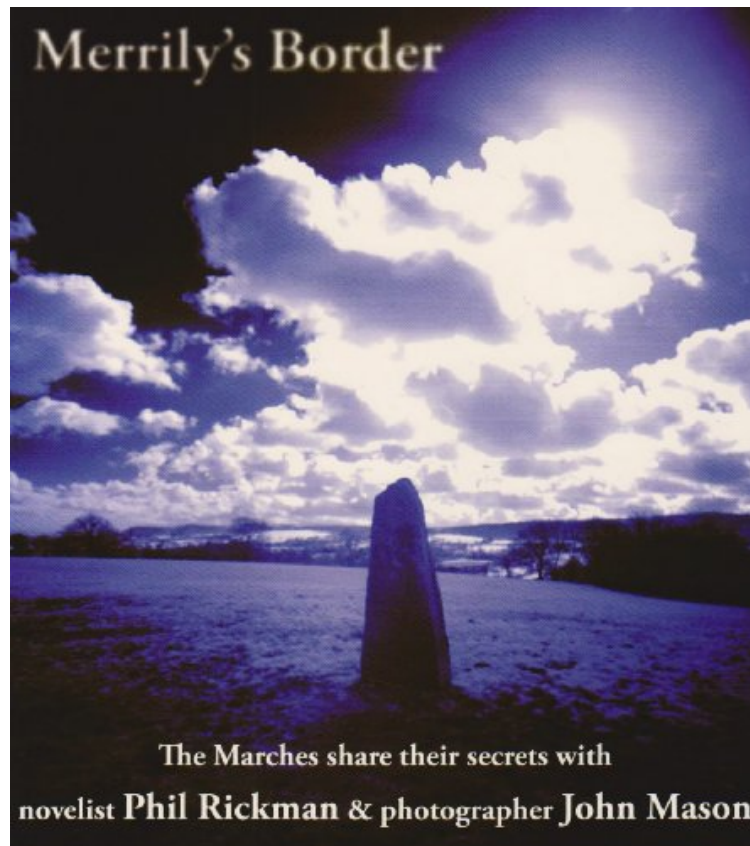

Firstly, the quality is really high- great paper, tonnes of richly coloured photos (John Mason's pictures are particularly moody melancholic).There is plenty of relevent text that is funny AND atmospheric (as we'd expect from Phil). It conjurs up the area without giving away key plot lines (I've no idea how he managed it). There are no (in Phil's words) "look away now" moments, but he STILL manages to give some background to how ( why) he wrote each of the Merrily books.Even if someone HADN'T read the books they'd

still get some sense of the area it's folklore, traditions mystical happenings. It isn't rammed full of eyewatering information, which is good- it does however, give pointers signposts ( a good bibliography).Buy it. If you haven't already realised I like it, but not because it's Phil's book. Not even because it's got Merrily, Jane Gomer in. Not even because it is Ledwardine. But because it is all these things AND a beautifully lush travel guide that fills a gap while the next Merrily arrives :~)
