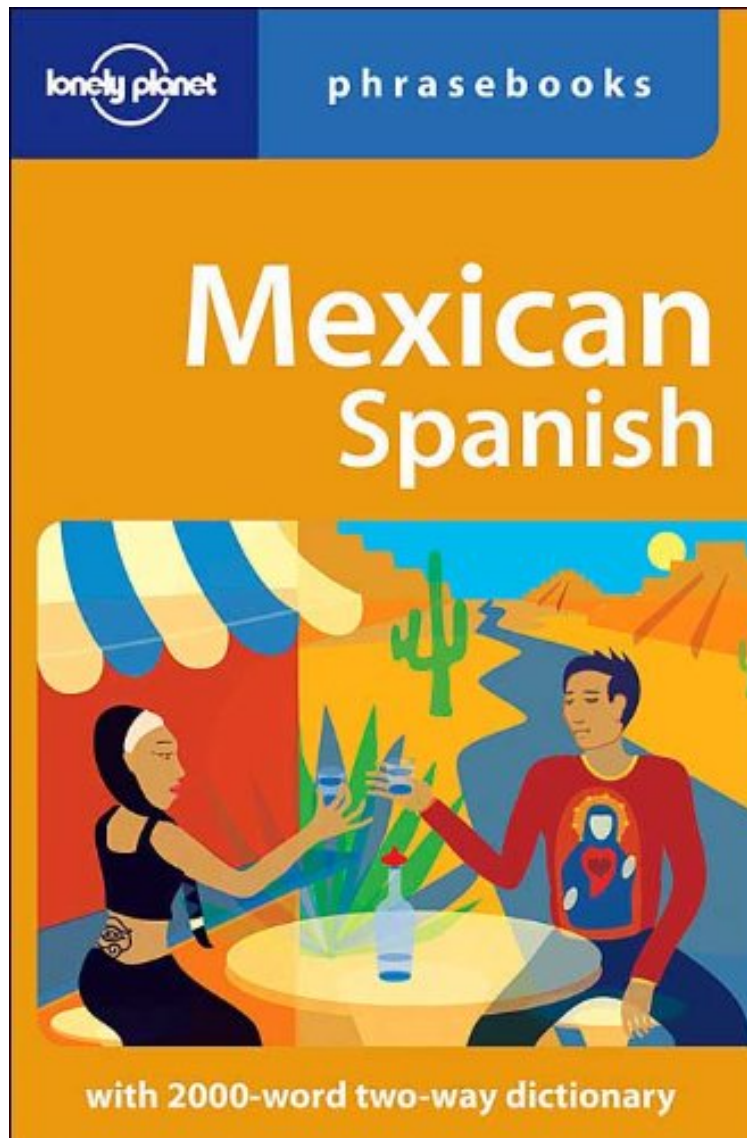

I have been trying to learn enough of their language to "get by". This book could be a tremendous help. However, it is printed in very small print, as the book itself is pocket sized, a nice size to carry with me. The small print is understandable but the pastel colors of the text is more than difficult to read, especially since the print is so tiny. I think whoever put this book together was going for "attractive" but what I need most is black text! Otherwise, I would recommend this book to anyone who has some Spanish, surely not to someone who has not done at least a little studying of the language. The book is well designed, just, harping on it again, the text needs to be black or at least dark red, navy blue, dark brown, dark green - to differentiate subjects. It is almost impossible to see the tildes and accent marks. One needs a magnifying glass!
