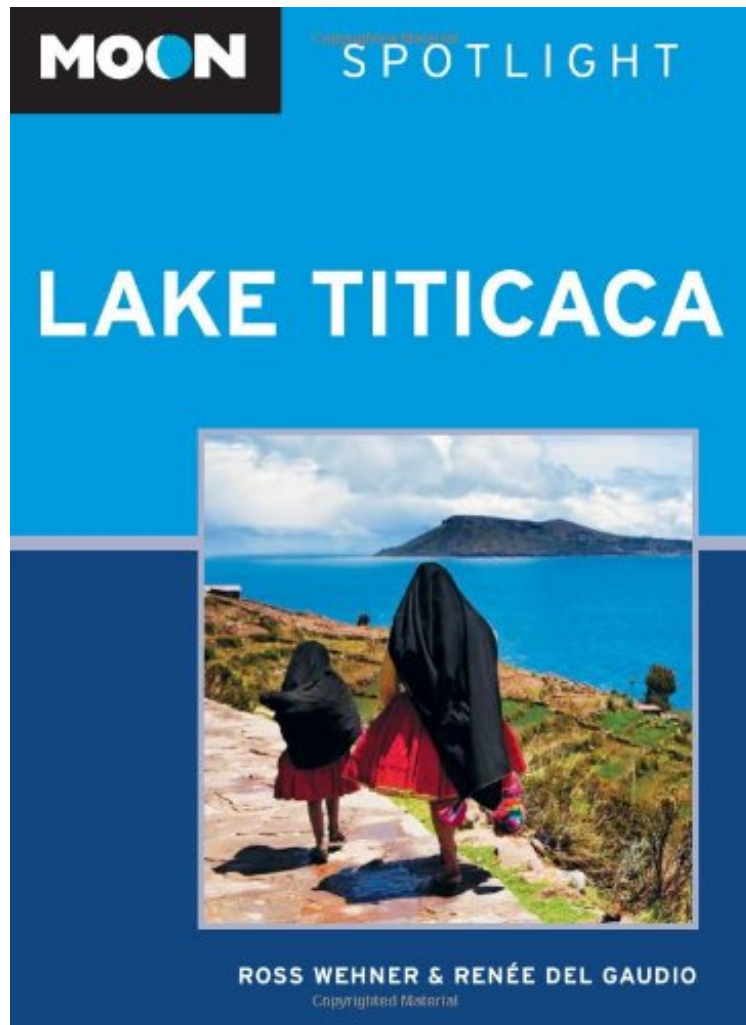

It incorrectly indicates no tourist visa is required to gain entry into Bolivia for US citizens. A tourist visa has been required for US citizens since 2007. Current cost is \$135, cash only. The title implied the book contains information about tourism around the entire region of Lake Titicaca. It does not. It appears to be a brief excerpt from the Peruvian Moon book. It contains more information about the Arequipa and Colca Canyon Region of Peru (40 pages) than it does the Titicaca region of Peru (20 pages) and has essentially no information about the Bolivian side of Lake Titicaca - though the description doesn't
