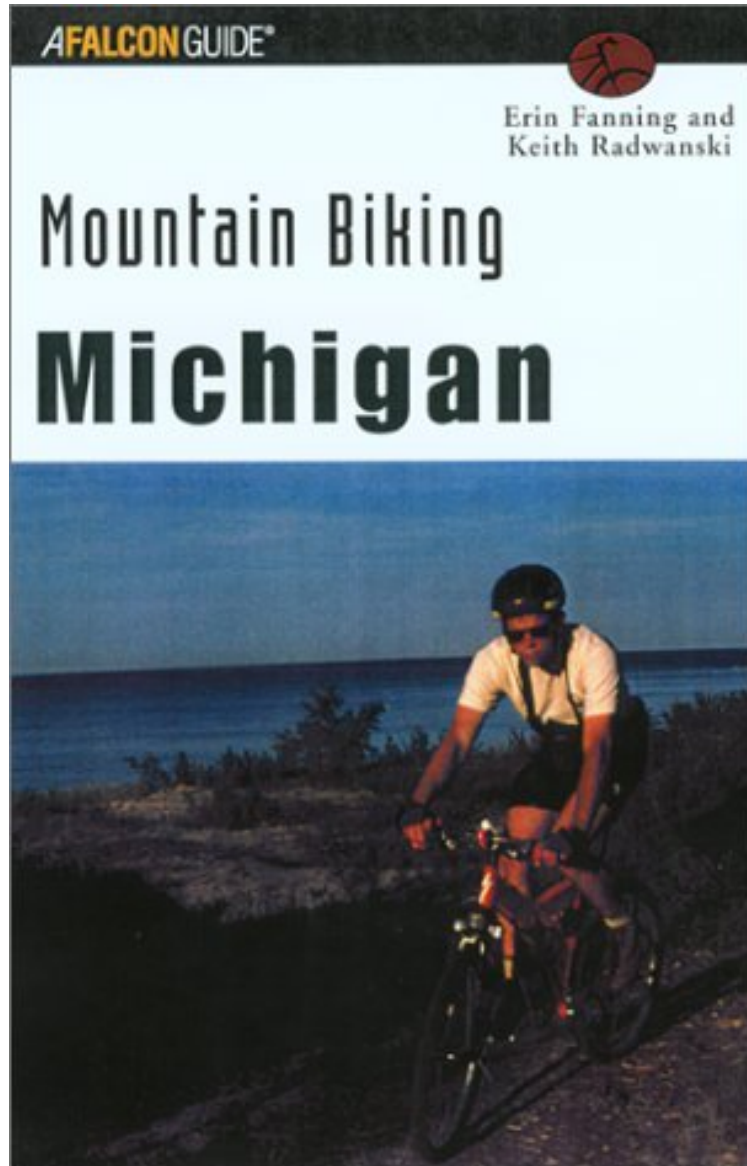

This book includes 67 rides, most of which are on singletrack, showcasing the best of Michigan.
