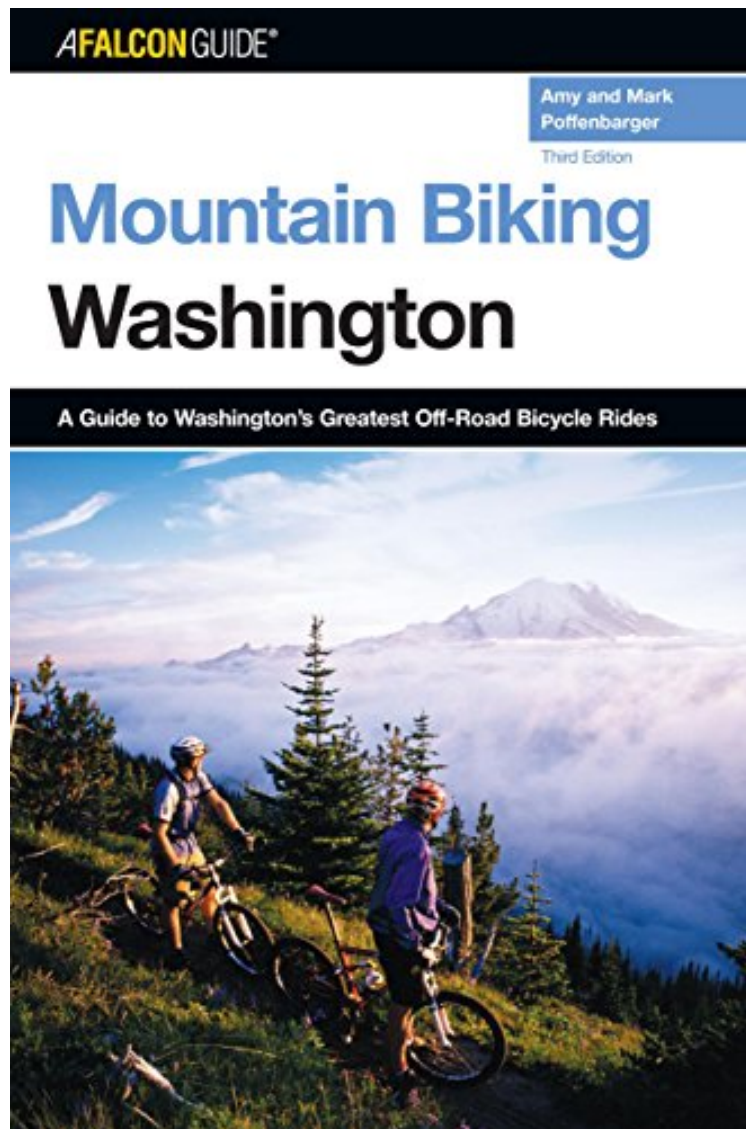

It is telling that the only "trail" ride that they mention anywhere near the second largest city in Washington (Spokane) is a paved path that runs right through the city. Hardly a mountain bike trail, it is usually frequented by road bikes and runners. Having spent many years in the middle of the state, I will say that both sides of Washington have amazing bike trails, separated by a massive and immature cultural stigma that keeps residents of either side from admitting that there is anything of value with their neighbors.
