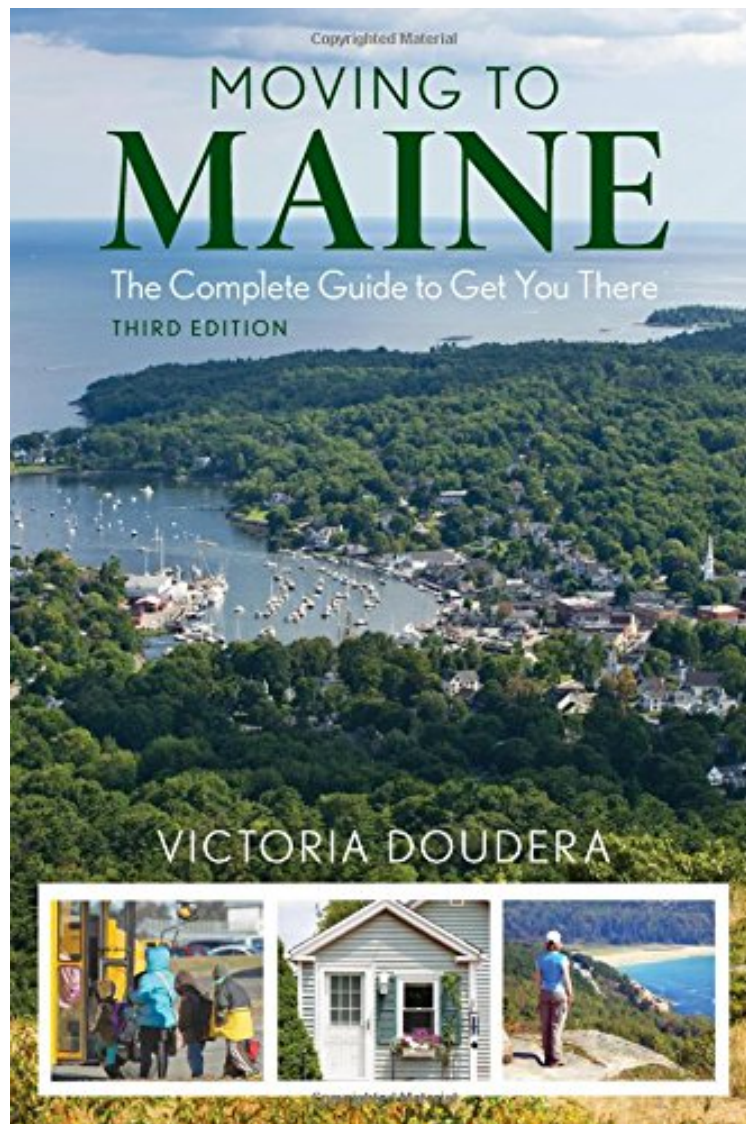

There is an extended introduction to Maine and its unique residents, but the heart of the narrative talks about jobs, housing, the weather, culture, family life, taxes, and registering automobiles, to name a few topics. At just under 200 pages, this book can't exhaust the subject, but there is plenty on offer here to think about. The author is clearly in love with the state, but that doesn't translate into a relentless sales pitch. Maine is different, but it seems to offer something that people value enough to keep moving to the state to get next to. No pictures or maps, unfortunately. Highly recommended as a planning resource.
